



Role Description:

2nd Africa Rover Moot – Activities Team Leader

The Africa Rover Moot is a gathering of Rover Scouts, under the auspices of the Africa Scout Region, and held every 3 years. The 2nd Africa Moot will be hosted by SCOUTS South Africa in 2026.

Role Purpose

1. To lead and manage a team to deliver exciting activities for 2nd ARM in accordance with SCOUTS South Africa (SSA) Constitution, Organisational Rules and Policies.
2. To represent the interests and views of the 2nd ARM Organising Committee in all interactions and communications.

Functions

1. Attend meetings of the Organising Committee and provide regular updates as required.
2. Propose, develop, and design a programme of activities for the 2nd ARM event, which:
 - Provides a wide variety of Scouting and adventure type activities, which are aligned with the Rover Programme and balanced with increasing awareness around key WOSM initiatives like 'Scouts for SDG's'.
 - Delivers fun, exciting, and adventurous activities for Rovers, building on the experiences of previous events.
 - Takes input on such activities from the Chair: National Rover Programme.
3. Appoint and develop a team of Activity Centre Leaders, who take responsibility for the implementation of the activities and the safety of the participants whilst engaged in the activities.
4. Source and allocate activity base leaders and staff to run each activity.
5. Source the required equipment for the activities, with the assistance of the activity base leaders.
6. Arrange a programme of evening entertainment and special events, including the opening and closing ceremonies.
7. In conjunction with the Chair: Organizing Committee perform any other duties as may reasonably be required to ensure a successful event.

Previous Experience

1. Knowledge and insight into the activities of Scouts SA and its programmes.
2. Have held a similar role for a large event or have experience in planning of large events.
