Springbok Award Registration Process & Timeline

1. A Scout must be at least sixteen (16) years old and must have completed all requirements for, and successfully achieved, their First Class advancement before registering for the Springbok Award, commencing the Springbok Journey, or completing any Springbok Theme Badges.
2. All aspirant Springbok Scouts must register as a Springbok Candidate with the SCOUTS South Africa National Office before commencing the Springbok Journey.
3. The final cut-off age for registering for the Springbok Award is six (6) months prior to the Scout's eighteenth (18th) birthday (i.e. at 17½ years old).
4. The Springbok Journey, together with preliminary proposals and concept plans, must be discussed with the Troop Scouter at the First Class Personal Growth Agreement (PGA).
5. The Springbok Award Registration Form must be completed by the Scout, in consultation with the Troop Scouter. This includes the initial planning for the completion of Section One and Section Two of the Springbok Journey.
6. When completing the Registration Form, the Scout must provide sufficient detail of the proposed activities in Section Two of the Springbok Journey: Living Outdoors, Adventure, Service, and Scout Skills, including an alternate date (Plan B) for each major planned activity, in the event that unforeseen circumstances prevent the activity from taking place as originally planned.
7. Once completed, the Registration Form must be signed by the Scout, thereby confirming their commitment to the proposed plan and timelines for the Springbok Journey.
8. The form must then be endorsed by the Troop Scouter, District Commissioner, and RTC: Scout Programme.
9. The Troop Scouter is responsible for forwarding the form to the RTC: Scout Programme and ensuring all endorsements are obtained up to Regional level.
10. A meeting will be held with the RTC: Scout Programme, or their nominee, where the Scout presents their planning concept and discusses the details of Section Two of the Springbok Journey. The RTC: Scout Programme will confirm that the plan meets the criteria of the award and will formally ratify the Registration Form.
11. The Springbok Award is a national award and must be endorsed and authorised by the Chair: National Scout Programme. The RTC: Scout Programme must submit a copy of the completed and endorsed Registration Form to the Chair within fourteen (14) days of the Scout signing the form.
12. The Scout will then be officially registered on the National Springbok Award database as a Springbok Candidate. Written confirmation will be provided within five (5) days of receipt of the form by National. Only once this confirmation has been issued by the Chair: National Scout Programme may the Scout begin any Springbok Award tasks or activities.
13. All Springbok Award requirements must be completed at least twenty-one (21) days before the Scout's eighteenth (18th) birthday. This ensures sufficient time for any necessary re-submissions or re-dos before the final cut-off at age eighteen.
14. Evaluation of all Section Two projects must be conducted by the RTC Scout Programme or their nominee. The RTC Scout Programme may appoint a specialist Springbok Coordinator from the Regional Support Team to provide guidance and liaison during the project.
15. The final Springbok Award Panel Interview should preferably be held before the Scout turns eighteen, but may take place within one (1) month after their eighteenth birthday.
