Our theme is "**Phezulu Nangaphezulu**" which is Zulu meaning *Higher and Higher*

- In the centre of the logo is the national bird of South Africa, the Blue Crane and over-layed is the "grus" constellation in the Southern Sky representing a crane
 - **A bird flying through the sky and reaching for the stars**
- Blue here represents the colour of the South African sky, which is often, a beautiful blue
- The navy blue represents our rich oceans
- Orange representing the colour of our African Sun, a colour of vibrance and life
- The World Scouting Emblem is represented in the bottom of the badge to align our goals with World Scouting



The Moot will be hosted at **Arrowe Park** an established Scouting camp ground in South Africa and will showcase many aspects of Scouting in Gauteng and South Africa

Distance from airport:

- Hiking and high ropes adventure course
- Modderfontein heritage site (associated with Baden-Powell's garrison following the Siege of Mafikeng)
- Environmental and community service locations are all within 30 minutes travel

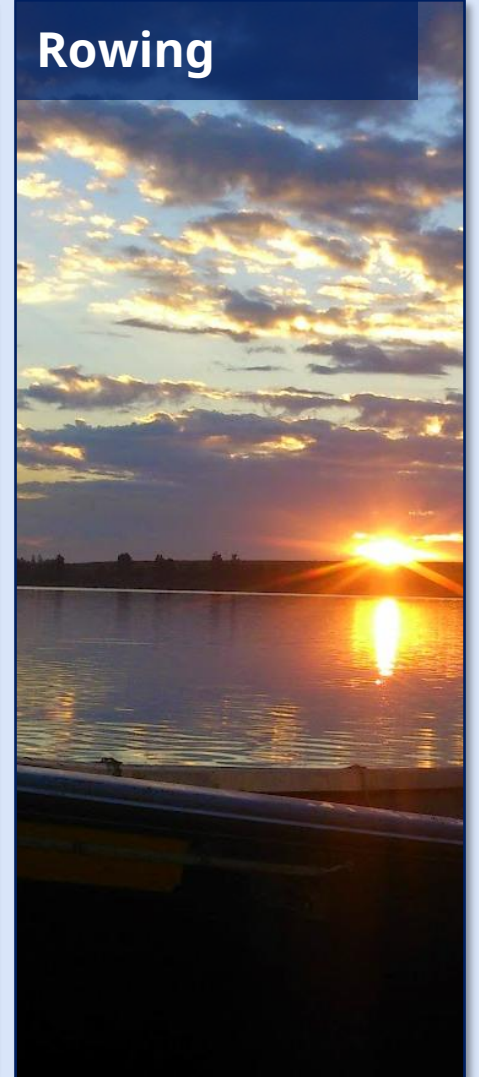

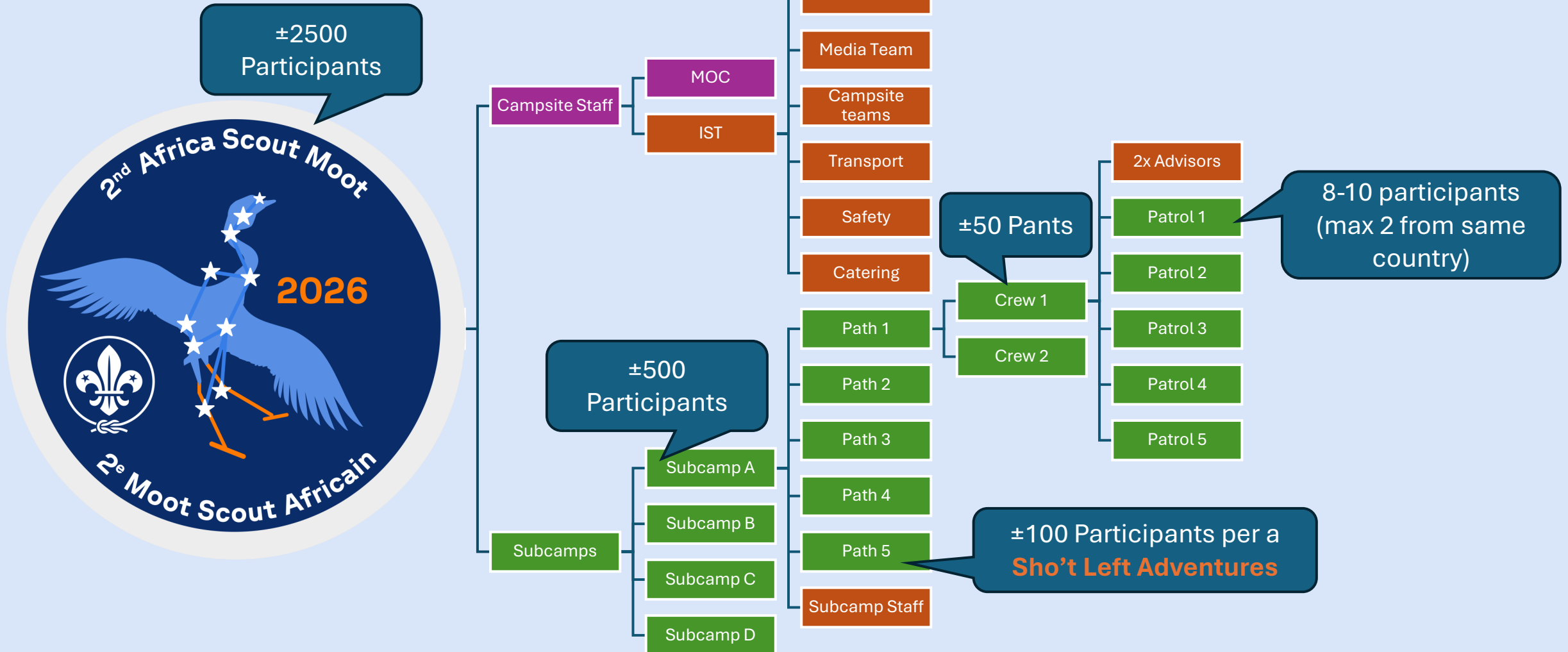

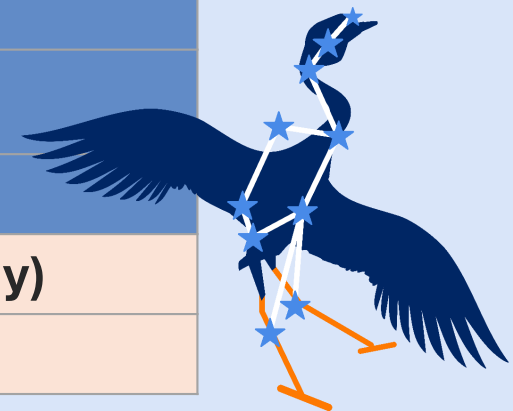
The Moot will be made up of **mixed international patrols**
