All over the world, there is an urgent need to address the Sustainable Development Goals, to mitigate Climate Change, and in particular to reduce CO2 emissions. In order to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all, we all have a role to play. As Scouts, it is our duty to get involved and to make a difference. This year as our SDG National Challenge SCOUTS South Africa is "Going Solar". As a Leader, you can set a good example and create more awareness about solar energy, by motivating your Scouts to complete the national challenge.

The Challenge:

Section 1: Sun is life

Requirement:

Conduct a household audit of electricity usage and propose ways in which to reduce it through solar power. Present your findings to your CC or RS.

Section 2: Impacts of the sun on health and the environment

Requirement:

To show the risks the sun can cause on health and the environment, develop a training aid to be used at a Pack or Troop meeting, on **TWO** of the following:

- · The greenhouse effect
- · UV rays
- Ozone
- Heat and hydration

Present these during a Pack or Troop meeting.

Section 3: Use of solar energy

Requirement:

To show different techniques of harnessing the suns energy, develop a training aid to be used at a Pack or Troop meeting, on **THREE** of the following:

- · Photo-thermal use of solar energy (heating houses and water)
- · Power production
- Cooking and conserving food
- Photovoltaic use of energy (solar cell (solar panels))
- · Direct use and storage
- · Misconceptions about solar energy

Present these during a Pack or Troop meeting.

Section 4: Go solar

Requirement:

Do **TWO** of the following:

- 1. Organise a solar introduction workshop at Pack or Troop level.
- 2. Install a warm water collector in your home or community centre.
- 3. Develop a social awareness campaign on social media to raise the awareness of solar in your community.

Reminders:

- National Rover Challenge deadline: 30 November 2022.

 All entries are to be submitted to your Regional Team Coordinator by 11 December 2022.
- On completion of the national challenge, the Rovers who took part will be awarded a special national challenge badge.
